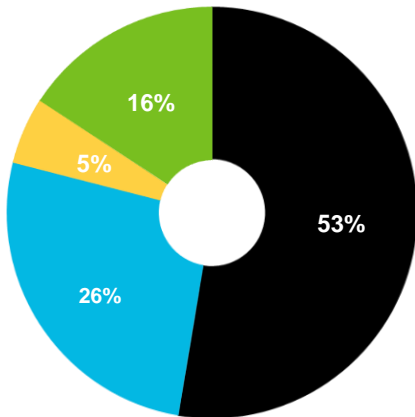

How is the Diversion Rate Calculated?

$$\frac{\text{Tonnage Recycled + Composted}}{\text{Total Waste Tonnage}} \times 100$$

What Does This Mean?

Waste diversion refers to *waste* that is *diverted* away from the landfill. A zero-waste event diverts at least **90%** of waste from landfill.

*The calculated diversion rate for this event includes cardboard and pallets.

COMPOST FACTS

Food scraps are processed at the CORE Newtown Creek Co-Digestion Facility in Brooklyn. The co-digestion process combines municipal wastewater and organics in an anaerobic digester, which produces a biogas (methane) as a byproduct. This methane is then used for heating within the facility and is connected to the natural gas grid to for residential and commercial buildings.

Under this program, Javits Center teams work closely with event managers and exhibitors to identify, collect and stage a wide range of items donated or left behind by exhibiting companies at the conclusion of the move-out period. These items, such as furniture, household products and construction materials, are often purchased for a one-time use and the JavitsCares program redirects these items to nonprofit organizations throughout the New York region.
